This is the second CCBC Conference. As at last year's inaugural meeting, the Nottingham Action Group on HMOs is hosting a parallel meeting of the National HMO Lobby, and members will take part in some of the core sessions of the Conference.

This unique event brings together councillors, grass root activists and local authority officers who are focussed on the need to maintain and rebuild balanced communities.

The day will focus on the impact that students and student housing have had, and continue to have, on communities where they concentrate but will also aim to take stock of the impact of recent regulatory reform in the Housing Act and the growing debate to give Local Authorities greater powers to control and plan housing through changes in planning legislation.

The day will provide a variety of views from councillors, local activists, the Government and MPs and aims to take stock of where we are now in the ongoing debate.

As ever, the day also aims to look at good practice and recent developments in the practical areas where the increasing management of lifestyle issues is important and examples are given of the uses of accreditation, transport policy, waste and litter and noise control.

The agenda brings together key-players, all of whom are committed to continuing development and to strengthening the concept of *'balanced community'*.

It should provide a stimulating day for everyone who is interested in and engaged with these issues.
